Parashat Devarim

Deut. 1:1-3:22

HAFTARA Isa. 40:1--26



נַחֲמוּ נַחֲמוּ עַמִּי יְאֹמֵר אֱלֹהֵיכֶם:

Comfort, oh comfort My people, Says your God.

The final book of the Torah opens with the first of three farewell discourses from Moses to the new generation of Israelites. These took the form of a review of past events as the Israelites crossed the wilderness towards Canaan, a compilation of many of the more important laws and a guide for the future.

First, Moses recalled God's commandment to the Israelites at Mount Horeb (Deuteronomy's name for Mt. Sinai), that they begin their long march which would culminate in the conquest of Canaan. "Wise men full of knowledge" had been appointed to help Moses in the civil, military and judicial administration of the people as they traveled on their journey.

Arriving at Kadesh Barnea, the Israelites had been instructed to attack Canaan and take possession of the hill country of the Amorites; instead, they had urged that spies be sent to ascertain conditions in the land. Angered by their response and their lack of faith, God had decreed that, apart from Caleb and Joshua, only their children - "that this day have no knowledge of good or evil" - would enter the Promised Land.

Then the people again ignored Moses' warning against any further defiance of God's will. They attacked Canaan and were heavily defeated. Only after many years wandering were they able to advance through the lands of the Edomites, the Moabites and the Ammonites, all of whom they were admonished not to engage in battle.

Sihon, king of the Amorites, and Og, king of Bashan, had refused to allow the Israelites through their land and each was defeated in battle and had his territory captured.

The conquered lands were divided among the half-tribe of Manasseh and among the Reubenites and Gadites.

These two-and-a-half tribes had been told, however, that they would be able to take possession of their territory only when they had helped the rest of the Israelites in the conquest of Canaan west of the River Jordan.
